MOTION was offered by Jimmie McCoy and duly seconded by Eddie Wagner to authorize the engineering firms for the Parish to complete the engineering work on Spring Ranch Road so the Parish can attempt to secure funding for the road project.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

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Parish legal advisor Blayne Honeycutt addressed agenda item 13, "Change name of Robin Lane to Miles Hodges Place." Mr. Honeycutt advised that the Parish ordinance requires a minimum of 75 percent of the residents living on a road to petition a name change. He further advised that the ordinance does not make a distinction between private and public roads with regard to petitions for road names.

The chair recognized Miles Hodges who discussed the judgment issued in the matter of Miles M. Hodges vs. Parish of Livingston, No. 121,140 "H". Mr. Hodges said Councilman Thomas Watson advised him subsequent to the judgment that he could do anything he wanted with the property. Mr. Hodges said he wants to change the name of his private servitude from Robin Lane to Miles Hodges Place. Mr. Hodges stated that the judgment signed by the Honorable Judge Zorraine Waguespack states that the Parish of Livingston is excluded from any rights to oversee the name or any other activity regarding this property.

Mr. Hodges said he is not asking the Council's permission to change the name of his private servitude but is allowing the Council to know that he is changing the name so that the Parish Permit Office can advise the 911 data base of his actions. Mr. Hodges said the Permit Office told him that the Council just needed to be made aware of the name change.

The chair recognized Robin Osborn and Mary Bendily, residents of Robin Lane, who advised the Council that the road was properly named in 1994 and that they oppose any name change. Ms. Bendily said the road is plotted on maps of the Parish as Robin Lane and she receives mail and other services at her Robin Lane address.

Mr. Hodges advised Ms. Bendily that she should have purchased the property when it was for sale if she wanted jurisdiction.

Mr. Honeycutt advised the Council not to take any action on this matter since the request for name change does not meet the requirement of the Parish ordinance.

The chair recognized Ralph Burgess who advised the Council that he was involved with the re-subdivision of this property in the late 1990s or early 2000. Mr. Burgess confirmed that both Mr. Hodges and Ms. Osborn have property servitude on Robin Lane that is properly recorded in the records of the Clerk of Court for the Parish of Livingston.

He said the judgment basically states that he is the owner of the property and can do whatever he wants. Mr. Hodges said he spoke with Councilman Watson who agrees with his position.

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The chair recognized Councilman Randy Rushing who said he was contacted by constituents regarding the unsanitary conditions at the North Livingston Voting Precinct, 32511 Louisiana Highway 63, which is owned by the Parish. Randy Delatte, Parish Department of Public Works, said the Parish inadvertently overlooked the cleaning of this voting place but that the problem leading to the oversight has been remedied.

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Councilman Thomas Watson left the Council Chambers and did not return prior to adjournment.
